







RESEARCH CENTRED ENVIRONMENT

Staff and students at Trinity conduct research at the frontiers of their disciplines, with exciting interaction between disciplines such as biology and engineering, business and social policy, creating new approaches to problem solving.

A research-centred education means you will be taught from day one by leading researchers and gain first-hand exposure to research activity, completing an independent piece of original research work as part of your Trinity degree, known as the Capstone project.

TRINITY'S LIBRARY

The largest library in Ireland, Trinity has been a deposit library since 1801, entitled to a copy of every title published in the UK and Ireland. The collection spans several facilities and holds upwards of six million volumes, including over half a million maps.

Although an institution of great antiquity, the Library pioneers modern methods of resource discovery and developments in the teaching, learning and research processes.

Dublin ranks 37th worldwide for best student cities⁴ and has more than 300 worldwide student exchange agreements.
