Trinity College Dublin, the University of Dublin, has been a world-renowned institution since its establishment in 1592. Over 425 years later, Trinity remains a global leader in high-quality, internationally-recognised education and pioneering research.

The Trinity International Foundation Programme is a 1-year pre-university programme. Students who successfully complete the International Foundation Programme and reach the required grades gain entry to the first year of undergraduate degrees at Trinity.

The Trinity International Foundation Programme is delivered at the campus of Trinity's associated college, Marino Institute of Education, where excellent student facilities and on-site accommodation are available. The Marino campus is a 15 minute journey from Trinity and the centre of Dublin city.


