New Incoming Undergraduates Teaching for new undergraduate students will begin on 05 October.*

Orientation (Freshers' week) will take place from 28 September to 02 October.

This will include some online introductory sessions on the use of online teaching plus a range of Fresher's week social activities and taster events from our clubs and societies. We expect to also have some elements of face-to-face activity dependent on government social distancing protocols at the time.

Trinity's Academic Year 2020/21

Postgraduates and Current Undergraduates Teaching for new postgraduate students and current undergraduate students will begin on 28 September.*

Postgraduate orientation takes place from 21 September.

* Some professional programmes and the International Foundation Programme will have different start dates and students on these programmes will be advised separately.

Hybrid Teaching

Semester 1 will follow a hybrid model which combines online and face-to-face elements such as offering online lectures for larger class groupings and face-to-face seminars, tutorials and laboratory classes for smaller groups.

As much face-to-face teaching and learning as possible will be provided under prevailing health and safety requirements.

A decision on the second semester will be taken closer to the time.

Health & Wellbeing

Health and Wellbeing Trinity students have access to both telephone supports and face to face consultations (where clinically indicated) from the University Health Centre while they are resident in Ireland. Any students directly affected by COVID-19 can access national healthcare services at no cost for Covid 19 related diagnosis and treatment**.

**All non-EEA students are required to have private medical insurance when coming to and residing in Ireland for the purpose of study. The private medical insurance should provide cover for accident and/or disease and should cover the student for any period of hospitalisation.
