

Biographical Information: Merrill Silverstein, Ph.D., is Professor of Gerontology and Sociology at the University of Southern California. He received his doctorate in sociology from Columbia University. Dr. Silverstein's research focuses on aging within the context of family life. His interests include intergenerational transmission, social support over the life-course, grandparent-grandchild relations, attitudes toward aging and the elderly, and international perspectives on aging families. He has over 100 publications, including the books *Intergenerational Relations Across Time and Place*, *Handbook of Theories of Aging*, and *From Generation to Generation: Aging Families in an Aging Society*. Dr. Silverstein is principal investigator of the Longitudinal Study of Generations, a project that has tracked multigenerational families over four decades. He also has projects in China, Sweden, the Netherlands, and Israel on topics of aging and intergenerational relations. Dr. Silverstein is a Fellow of the Gerontological Society of America, the Brookdale National Fellowship Program, and the Fulbright International Senior Scholars Program. He currently serves as editor-in-chief of the *Journal of Gerontology: Social Sciences*.
