



Deficits and research priorities across the cancer continuum for people with intellectual disabilities

 Cancer screening is very important to make sure that you don't have cancer.




 Research showed that less people with intellectual disabilities received treatment for cancer.

 Research showed that people with intellectual disabilities were more likely to die if they get cancer.

 We need more research to make sure that this stops.



 Research shows that less people with intellectual disabilities seem to get diagnosed with cancer.

 More research is needed to see if this is true or if cancer is just not being identified.



 More people are doing research on endof-life care for people with intellectual disabilities.
