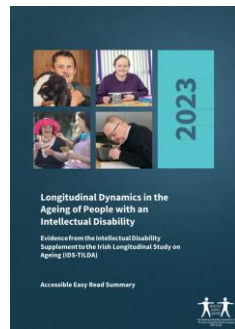

We have met lots of important people across Ireland and have been sharing what we learned with them.



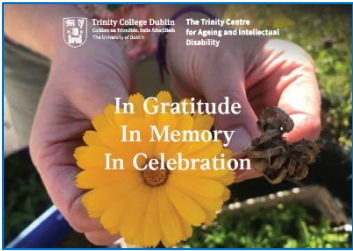
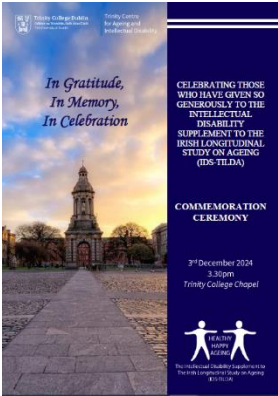
This is very important because it helps make life better for people with intellectual disabilities.

Translating IDS-TILDA Knowledge Into Policy And Practice Event



On the 17th and 18th of October we had event called IDEAS in Maynooth.



Lots of experts, researchers, service providers and advocates went to the event.



The conference was about how IDS-TILDA research can help make services and supports better for people with intellectual disabilities.



The event was organised by the Trinity Centre for Ageing and Intellectual Disability (TCAID) with the National Federation of Voluntary Service Providers.



The meeting helped people who care for older adults with learning disabilities.

It gave them ideas to make life better for these adults.



Some people with intellectual disabilities spoke about their experience of research making positive changes in their lives.

ECHOLIGHT BONE SCREENING MACHINE



There is a new research project at IDS-TILDA.

This project looks at using a new tool called the Echolight.



The Echolight tool is for bone screening for people with intellectual disability.



The tool looks at if you have weak or fragile bones.



This tool is recognised by the Irish Osteoporosis Society.



This bone screening tool is a different option to the DXA Scan because the DXA scan can sometimes be challenging for people with disabilities.



People from the Trinity Centre for Ageing and Intellectual Disability and Wexford Residential Intellectual Disability service worked on this project.



80 people with all kinds of intellectual disabilities from all over Ireland took part in this project.
