The EuCan study is being done by the Trinity Centre for Ageing and Intellectual Disabilities team in Trinity College Dublin with other professionals who work in research and practice.




Trinity is working in partnership with the Irish Cancer Society, who is paying for the study.





Your decision will not affect the supports you receive.







