Our 2nd year students have also successfully completed their final year of the **Certificate in Arts, Science and Inclusive Applied Practice**. They are all

looking forward to their graduation here in Trinity College Dublin in Autumn 2018.

Earlier this year the 2nd year students completed their work placement module where they worked for one morning each week with one of our business partners. In their own words, here are some comments about the placements:

SciFest@TCPID 2018

We hosted our second annual **SciFest@TCPID** student exhibition and awards in the Science Gallery in Trinity College Dublin on May 31st. Many of you were at this wonderful event.

The SciFest event was opened by Dr. Kevin Mitchell, the Associate Dean of Undergraduate Science Education in Trinity College Dublin and by Professor Damian Murchan, Head of the School of Education.

SciFest @TCPID is an initiative that was developed in 2017 in association with **Abbott Ireland** and **SciFest**. SciFest was founded over 10 years ago by Sheila and George Porter. The SciFest programme aims to encourage a love of science, technology and maths through active, collaborative, inquiry-based learning and to provide a forum for students at local, regional and national level to present and display their scientific investigations. The SciFest@TCPID exhibition in 2017 was the first time that the programme had specifically included an exhibition for students with intellectual disabilities.

Abbott Ireland provided a team of mentors to work with our students on their science projects over a six week period. The Abbott team included Ciara Hayes, Sinead Hickey, Derek Kelly, Katie Holian, Rosemary Clarke, Renata Futo, Deirdre Mulholland and Silvia Onos. The mentors worked with our students every week and a fantastic bond developed between each project team. It was an incredibly rewarding experience for everyone involved.

Some of the project topics in this year's exhibition included:

Music Through Bones, which looked at how music can affect your mood

AerLuke, which looked at the origins of aircrafts and included an experiment on crafting the perfect paper airplane

Advancement of soccer from Pele to Ronaldo, which looked at the differences in soccer and soccer equipment over the past 50 years

Singing Science, which examined the vocal range differences between men and women

#MoodFood, which looked at food flavours and included a blind taste experiment involving a number of different flavoured foods.

Appointment of National and Schools Coordinator

Following the news in our last TCPID Business Partners Update about the Social Innovation Fund Ireland award, we have received funding to allow us to appoint a National and Schools Coordinator, Des Aston. Des is responsible for establishing a National Forum of Higher Education Providers with the aim of supporting the existing and future inclusive educational programmes for people with intellectual disabilities across Ireland to become sustainable.

This National Network of inclusive Higher Education Providers will collaborate and work towards ensuring young people with intellectual disabilities have real choices after they leave secondary level education. The National Forum of Higher Education Institutions will act as a live database of viable, accessible and appropriate pathways through education for young people with intellectual disabilities across Ireland.

TCPID's National and Schools Coordinator will also be responsible for promoting positive and early transition planning across secondary schools in Ireland for students with intellectual disabilities. By conducting site visits to secondary schools and by speaking with students, teachers, guidance counsellors etc. Students with intellectual disabilities will be able to take ownership of their own educational journey and be able to plan for their future at a much earlier stage than is currently the case.



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Graduate Internship Programme

As part of the development of our TCPID Graduate Internship programme, our students who recently completed their final year are all currently working with TCPID business partners. The companies who have offered the internships are:
