






1 - Academic Affairs Annual Report 2020/21

 Priorities in a given academic year. 2020/21 was an especially busy year for the team in
 supporting the development of new course proposals and micro-credentials under the Higher
 Education Authority (HEA) Human Capital Initiative (HCI) Pillar 3, and in supporting 14 Trinity
 projects awarded funding under the Strategic Alignment of Teaching and Learning Enhancement
 (SATLE) in Higher Education Fund 2019 and 2020.


2 - Academic Affairs Website
