


Academic Affairs, TT&L

- Supporting the Academic Secretary and Annual Academic Officers (Senior Lecturer and Dean of Undergraduate Studies, Dean of Graduate Studies, and the Registrar) on policy de velopment, committee work and strategic initiatives.
