Foreword

Welcome to this edition of the combined Trinity Teaching and Learning (TT&L) 2020/21 and 2021/22 Annual Report. Established in 2015/2016, TT&L was tasked with informing and guiding the pedagogical practices, policies and structures that shape the educational experiences of undergraduate and postgraduate students at Trinity. Working closely with College Academic Officers, TT&L has adopted a people-first approach, with a focus on creating a culture of quality that supports academic excellence and a positive student experience.

TT&L is led by the Academic Secretary and supported by a team of higher education professionals and support staff, who have considerable expertise across the span of the student academic lifecycle.

In March 2020, in response to the Covid-19 pandemic, Trinity took the necessary steps to transform from a traditional university campus to a connected digital campus. While the fallout of the pandemic has been far reaching, the acceleration of change and pedagogical innovation it brought about is welcomed. Some of the lessons learnt are now shaping how teaching and learning is delivered throughout the university, placing digital learning at the heart of higher education and, for many, leading to the re-invention of teaching, learning and assessment practices across the disciplines.

The aim of this combined Annual Report is to provide an overview of activities and developments across the five units of TT&L (<u>Academic Affairs</u>; <u>Centre for Academic Practice</u>; <u>Careers Services</u>; <u>Quality Office</u>; <u>Trinity Access Programmes</u>) during the period in question. The Report also highlights the contribution and achievements made by the units across TT&L towards the University's strategic goals, particularly with respect to Goal 1, Goal 3 and Goal 6.

The academic years 2020-21 and 2021-22 presented unprecedented challenges for teaching and learning and the resilience and commitment to the University of the TT&L staff at this most difficult time is highly commended.




