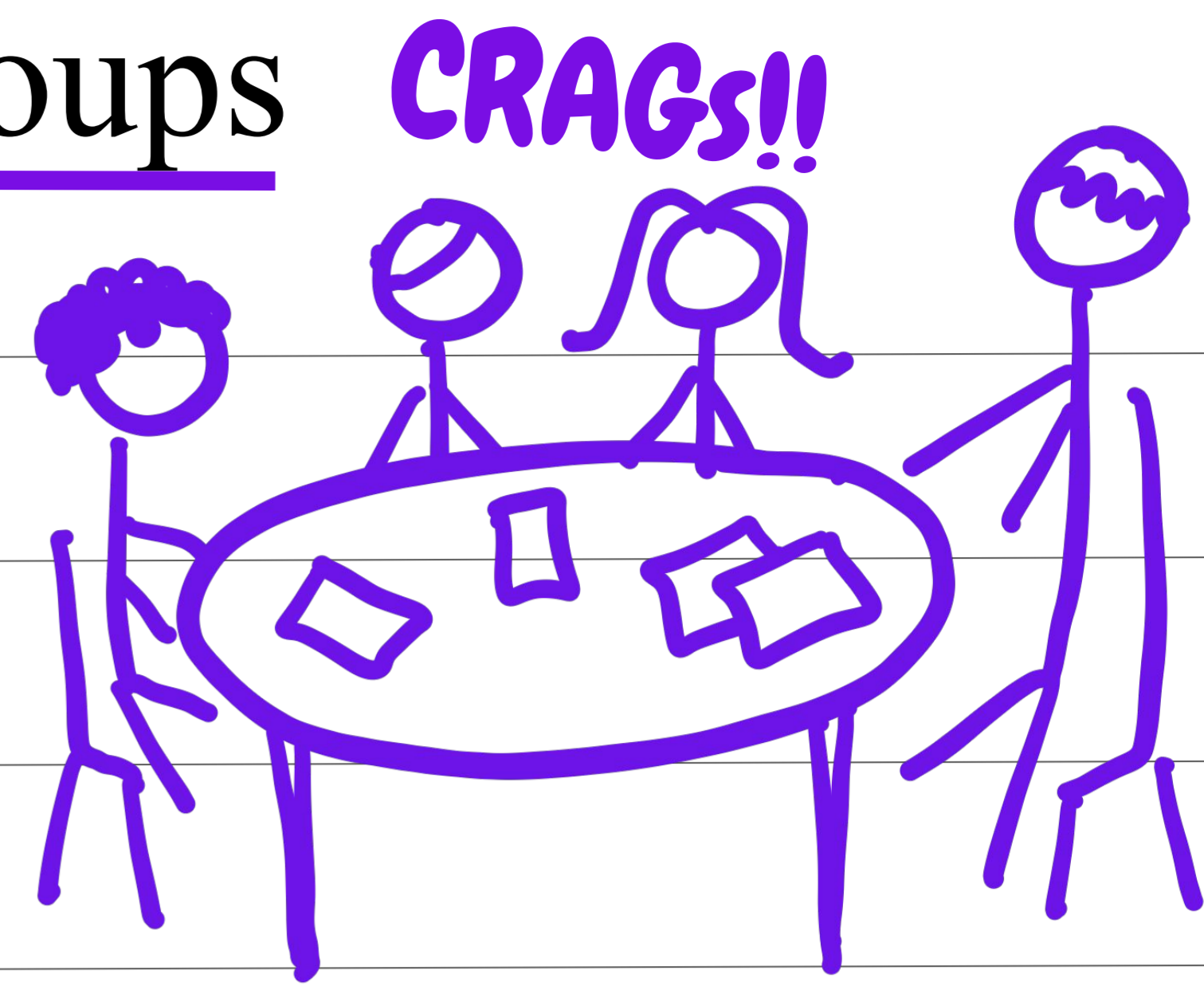

Children have the right, under the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of the Child, to give meaningful input on research that concerns them¹.

That means you have to actually listen to what we say.

Children can contribute to all stages of a research project: designing research questions², data collection³, analysis⁴, and dissemination⁵
